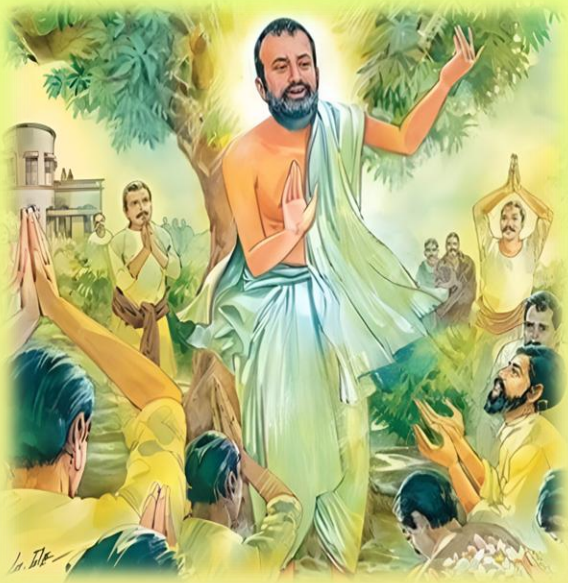

*Sri Ramakrishna Considered ‘God Realization’ the ultimate aim of life. On the first day of the year 1886 at Cossipur Garden House Sri Ramakrishna felt much better after a long time of illness and came out of his room and went to the garden where Girish Chandra Ghose, the famous dramatist and some devotees gathered soon around him in awe and reverence. Hearing some eulogistic words of Girish Chandra Ghose Sri Ramakrishna stood motionless in divine ecstasy and blessed him and other devotees by touching them and exhorting them to get awakened spiritually with the following words of benediction – Tomader Chaitanya Hok (May you attain to the state of Consciousness! / Tum sabon ko Chaitanya ki prapti ho!) and each one of them got awakened and had vision of their desired deities. Sri Ramakrishna left his mortal coil on 16 August, 1886 but the first day of the year 1886 and onwards was considered as “Wish Fulfilling Day” and Sri Ramakrishna as a “Wish Fulfilling Tree (Kalpa Taru)” by devotees.
